The Board of Commissioners ("Board") of Harris County Emergency Services District No. 50 ("District") met by telephone conference call on April 5, 2021, in accordance with the duly posted notice of said meeting and with the March 16, 2020 Order of Governor Abbott, with a quorum of Directors present, as follows:

Also present were Mr. Bob Ideus, Mr. Jimmy Sumbera, Chief Ryan Thistle, and Mr. Wm. Scott Smith.

The meeting was called to order and declared open for such business as might regularly come before it.

- 1. The Board opened the floor for public comment. No public comment was presented.
- 2. The Board unanimously approved the minutes of the March 1 and 15, 2021 meetings.
 - 3. Commissioner Biggers entered the meeting.
- 4. The Board reviewed the property tax collection report indicating that 2020 taxes are 93.7% collected.
- 5. Mr. Ideus presented the bookkeeper's report. Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the Board approved the bookkeeper's report and the checks listed thereon.
- 6. Mr. Sumbera presented the administrator's report indicating that there were 1,171 EMS calls billed for the year. Two firefighters have resigned leaving three vacancies in the fire division. There is one vacant EMS position. There was an accident with Reserve Ladder 32. The other party has taken responsibility for the repairs which currently are being conducted. One employee currently is on leave for COVID-19. The department continues to work on completion of the audit, the ISO notice to District constituents, and reimbursement for charity care.
- 7. The Board reviewed and update on legislative matters impacting the District from the District's legislative consultant.
- 8. The District is waiting on the final pay estimate for the training facility in order to complete that project.
 - 9. Commissioner Owens updated the Board with to activities at the dispatch

center. The Board noted the good performance of the ECOM facility during the winter storm event. Mr. Owens stated that it became apparent that the breakroom currently is undersized, and efforts are being undertaken to expand the breakroom into a full kitchen.

- 10. With respect to cybersecurity training Mr. Sumbera stated that his staff is working on completing the training requirements as required by law.
- 11. Chief Thistle presented the fire chief's report and noted there were 371 EMS calls with an average response time of approximately 5 minutes. There were 155 fire suppression calls. The annual physical exams are being completed and extrication training currently is underway. The new EMS supervisor vehicle has been placed in service.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.

ESD Priority Watch List

HB 2323 / SB 1473, Schofield / Miles on removal of territory from a district;

This bill (with an unconstitutionally broad caption) would allow a city to force an ESD to remove territory to which the city could provide emergency services.

No activity yet other than bill referral. Discussions have been held with sponsors. Bill(s) considered dead for session.

HB 553 / Thompson, on County approval of ESD budgets and tax;

Would require county approval for an ESD budget and tax rate.

Bill was heard in committee April 20th. Sponsor indicates that the problem addressed by the bill has been resolved, and that it is no longer a priority to him. Bill still active, though.

HB 639 (White), allowing ESDs to provide public health services.

Allows an ESD to provide public health services, under H&S 121.006(d), which are (1) personal health promotion and maintenance services; (2) infectious disease control and prevention services; (3) environmental and consumer health programs; (4) public health education and information services; (5) laboratory services; and (6) administrative services.

Bill reported from committee April 19th, awaiting placement on House calendar.

HB 2966 / Tinderholt, repeals the de minimis ad valorem tax rate;

Caption is self-explanatory.

No activity other than bill referral. Bill considered dead for the session, but amendments to other bills still a concern. See SB 1429 below.

HB 4457 / Schofield, Changes the point of sale for sales tax purposes;

For internet / phone sales in which the delivery was from a point in Texas (such as a fulfilment center), the sales tax situs would be the point of shipping rather than the point of delivery. Would obviously affect various ESDs differently, but I predict a negative impact on the districts that Wayne and I represent. Expect opposition from the comptroller on this.

No activity other than bill referral. Matter has been discussed with bill sponsor. Bill considered dead for session.

HJR 115 / Martinez, raises the ESD ad valorem tax limit;

Raises the constitutional cap on ESD ad valorem taxes from 10 cents to 15 cents. Would still require statutory authorization, and could also raise SB 2 obstacles. Prospects for the bill in Senate Local Government not good.

No activity other than bill referral. Bill considered dead for session.

HB 1888 (Fierro), HB 3119 (Longoria), and SB 1515 Gutierrez), allowing teleconference meetings for all government agencies.

None of these bills have had a hearing yet. They are all probably dead for session. However, see SB 861 below.

SB 861 (Paxton), allowing remote meetings.

This would allow us to continue to meet by teleconference after the emergency declaration expires. It was reported from committee April 9th, and is still awaiting consideration by the full Senate.

SB 999 (Hancock), HB 4115 (Oliverson), balanced billing for ambulances.

Bill as filed would have had a negative impact on EMS revenue. Amended bill passed Senate in acceptable form, would only apply to municipal and county services. Being watched in House. The Texas EMS Alliance is taking a lead on this.

SB 999 has passed the Senate and has been referred to House Insurance. Scheduled for committee hearing April 27th.

SB 1429 (Bettencourt), additional notice for de minimis rate.

Would require an addition to the published tax notices when de minimis tax rate exceeds voter approval rate, to explain why there won't be an election, and can't be a petition.

Out of committee in Senate, not yet on Senate calendar. Bill workable, but being watched for amendment.
